### OBJETIVOS Y COMPETENCIAS

a) OBJETIVOS:

IC-FDG-2014. The aim of IC-FDG-2014 is to further elaborate the model of Functional Discourse Grammar (FDG). A full treatment of FDG may be found in: Hengeveld, Kees and Mackenzie, J. Lachlan 2008. *Functional Discourse Grammar: A typologically-based theory of language structure*. Oxford: Oxford University Press.

IPC-FDG-2014. This intensive course on the theory of Functional Discourse Grammar is organized during the days preceding IC-FDG-2014 to enable linguists unfamiliar with the theory to prepare for participation in the conference. The course is organized with doctoral students in mind.

### METODOLOGÍA

IC-FDG-2014. All sessions at the conference will be plenary, so as to enhance discussion between participants. A poster session will be part of the programme. Papers and posters on all aspects of FDG are welcome. The language of the conference will be English. The time of every paper will be divided as follows: 30 minutes of presentation and 10 minutes of discussion of the participants.

IPC-FDG-2014. The Professor Keizer will teach the course intensively. She will combine theoretical sessions with sessions with a workshop format, using her forthcoming new textbook on Functional Discourse Grammar. Students are assumed to have read the book before the course. After a review of the theory as a whole and discussion of some selected exercises from the textbook, a number of examples (from English as well as other languages) will be analyzed during the last afternoon so as to develop some analytical skills using the tools offered by FDG.
