Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 3500 characters, including spaces)

After finishing my bachelor's degree in English Philology at the University of Córdoba, I worked as Language Assistant in Spanish in Wheaton College (MA, USA) for one academic year. Afterwards I completed the Master in 'Inglés como Vehículo de Comunicación Intercultural' at the University of Jaén, writing a Master's thesis on the narratological influences of Edgar Allan Poe on the work of H.P. Lovecraft. I obtained, then, a position as interim teacher at the University of Córdoba for one semester, which brought me into contact with University teaching.

I was awarded with a predoctoral scholarship FPDI by the Junta de Andalucía, in the framework of which I worked on my PhD thesis for four years. The thesis, entitled "Communal Decay: Narratological and Ideological Analysis of H.P. Lovecraft," approaches the ideological substratum of this writer through his texts, making special use of the Lacanian distinction between the Real and reality, and the ways of acceding the former, which is hidden and unapproachable, as well as focusing on the relevance of the idea of communal decay.

During that period, I made a research stay of three months at the University of Nottingham. Furthermore I attended several international conferences and received specific training as University teacher. Two publications are the result of this period: a book chapter and an article in the journal "Lovecraft Annual". This book chapter is especially related to this project, since it analyzes the presence of cursed and hidden lineages in Lovecraft's works.

After the defence of my thesis, I obtained a position as full-time interim teacher at the Department of Filologías Inglesa y Alemana of the University of Córdoba, where I find myself at the moment, combining teaching and research activities. Since then, I have published several articles and book chapters and I am teaching courses of different areas of English Philology. I had a research stay at the University of Brown in August 2015, where I was working on Lovecraft's manuscripts, and I have a three-month long research stay scheduled for February-May 2020 at the University of Manchester. I am also a member of the Research Project FFI2016-75589P, which allowed me to have constant contact with members of the team, getting a solid theoretical background on secrecy and community theoretical approaches, that I used on several of my publications and conference contributions. I am currently immersed in the process of publishing a monograph on H.P. Lovecraft, derived from my PhD dissertation. Since September '20, I hold a position as Assistant Professor at the Department of English and German Studies at the University of Córdoba (Spain).

In this trajectory, I have tried to carry out a constant mobility, both in my visits to the United States, England and Ireland, and in the Master's at the University of Jaén. As far as research is concerned, I have consistently focused on gothic and fantastic 19th and 20th century literature. As a trope intrinsic to these literary modes, I have paid attention to the question of the secret.
